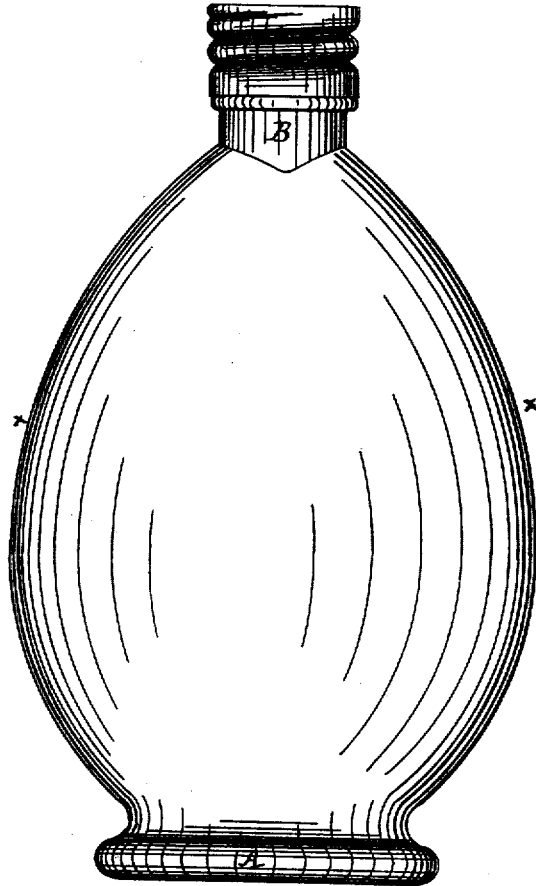
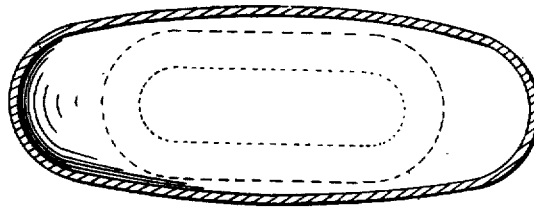

## DESIGN FOR LIQUOR-FLASKS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,085**, dated July 3, 1877; application filed June 12, 1877.  
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, ERNEST R. LILIENTHAL, of the city of San Francisco, county of San Francisco and State of California, have invented, originated, and designed a Pattern for Liquor Flasks, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making a part of this specification.

My design consists of a liquor-flask having a small flat-bottomed beaded base, A. From this base the flask proper springs, the outer configuration of which curves gradually until it reaches the points  $x x$ . From this point it

slopes nearly in a straight line until reaching the throat B of the neck. The top of the neck-piece is threaded on the outside. The two main sides of the flask springing from the rounded side edges are compressed nearly flat, as shown in cross-section, Fig. 2.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for liquor-flasks, substantially as shown and described.
