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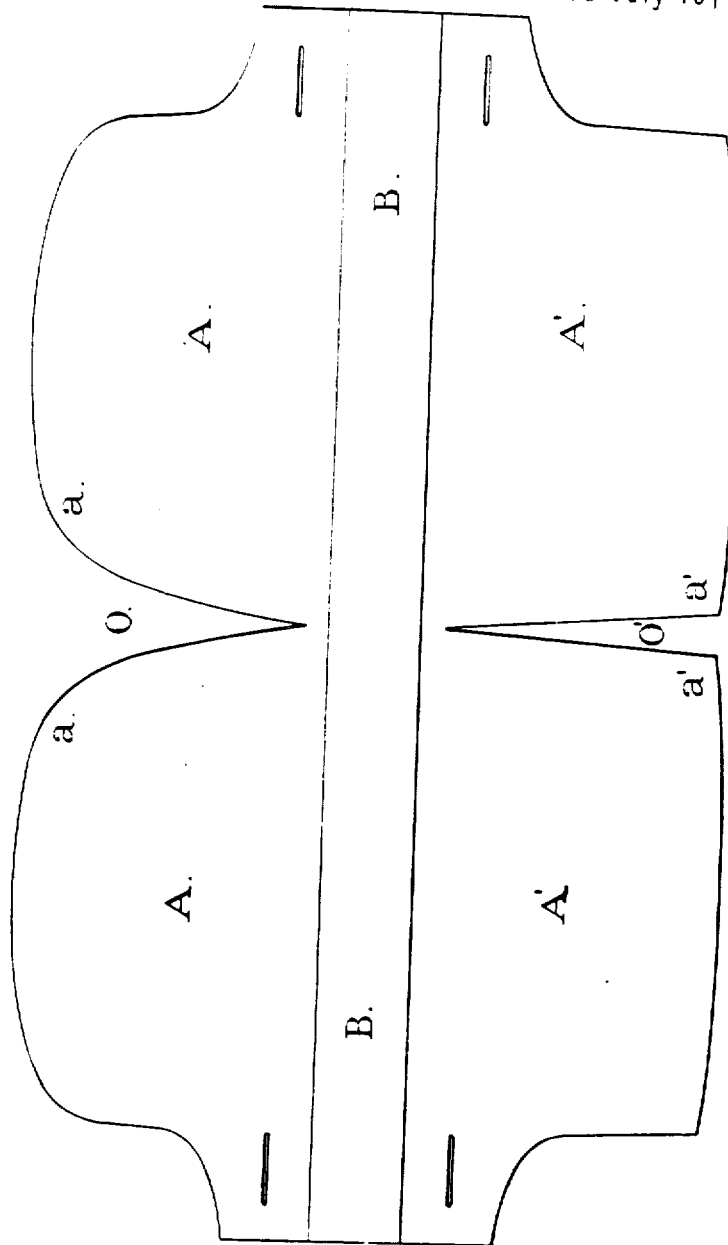

EMELINE A. LITCHFIELD, OF SOMERVILLE, MASSACHUSETTS.

DESIGN FOR A CUFF.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,093**, dated July 10, 1877; application filed June 4, 1877.
[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{4}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, EMELINE A. LITCHFIELD, of Somerville, in the county of Middlesex and State of Massachusetts, have originated a new Design for a Cuff, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making a part of this specification.

A A and A' A' represent the faces of the cuff, and B B the cuff-band.

On each side of the band the cuff is separated into two parts—A A on one side, and A' A' on the other—by the slits or openings O and O', running to, or nearly to, the band.

The parts A A are rounded at their corners *a a* adjacent to the opening O, and the parts A' A' are made angular at their corners *a' a'* adjacent to the opening O', as shown.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for a cuff, as herein described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
