DESIGN FOR PLAYING-CARDS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,099**, dated July 17, 1877; application filed June 30, 1877.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ALFRED J. MANNING, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a new Design for Playing-Cards, of which the following is a specification:

The central spade emblem *a* is contained within a panel, *c*, consisting of a striped ground surrounded by an oval border, *b*. Within the emblem *a* is a trefoil, *i*, having on its branch three leaves, and a rosette in the center. On both sides, and at the top of the border *b*, are the ornamental figures *e*, and below the panel is a scroll ornamented below the center by a figure, *e'*.

I claim—

1. The design for the ace of spades, con-

sisting of the ornamented emblems *a* on a striped panel, *c*, inclosed within the oval border *b*, as shown and described.

2. The scroll *f*, arranged below the panel containing the emblem *a*, as set forth.

3. The panel and scroll, ornamented by the figures *e e'*, as shown and described.

4. The emblem *a*, ornamented by the trefoil *i*, as shown and described.
