

DESIGN FOR CIGAR-BOX.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10. 108, dated July 24, 1877; application filed May 26, 1877.

[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Samuel Lowenthal, of the city of Cincinnati, Hamilton county, State of Ohio, have invented a Design for a Cigar-Box, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of the design consists of grooves cut into the surfaces of said box, as shown in the accompanying photographic illustration, there being upon each surface of the square box four grooves, all right-angular grooves, one running along each edge and parallel thereto.

The cigar-box may be made of any material, and, with exception of above-described grooves, is the same as an ordinary cigar-box.

What I claim is-

The box provided with the grooves, as above described.
