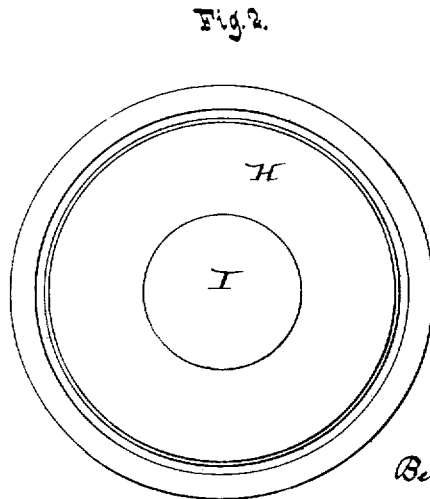
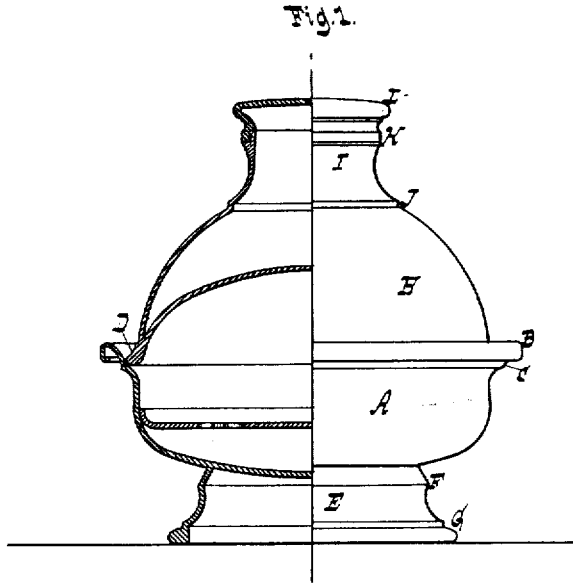

DESIGN FOR BUTTER-COOLERS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,122**, dated July 24, 1877; application filed June 20, 1877.
[Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern :

Be it known that I, BERNHARDT T. STEINHARDT, of the city, county, and State of New York, have originated a new Pattern for Covers for Butter-Dishes, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making part of this specification, in which drawing—

Figure 1 is a sectional side view of my design. Fig. 2 is a plan or top view thereof.

Similar letters indicate corresponding parts.

My design consists in a cover for butter-dishes, having a bead on its lower edge, a convex top part, and a cap, which is joined with the cover by a square shoulder, and is thence curved inward, being ornamented with a square band and a round top flange, by all of which features I obtain a cover having a handsome and distinguishing appearance.

In the drawings, A represents a butter dish resting on a base or pedestal, E.

H represents the circular cover, constructed according to my design, and is provided with a bead, D, on its lower edge, while its top

part is convex. This cover is surmounted by a cap, I, and at the point where the cap joins the cover is a square shoulder, J. From the point of the shoulder J the cap is curved inward, as shown. Near the top edge of the cap I is a square band, K, while said top edge has the form of a flange, L, of round shape.

What I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for the cover of a butter-dish, said cover having a bead, D, on its lower edge, a convex top part, and a cap, I, which is joined with the cover by a square shoulder, J, and is thence curved inward, being ornamented with a square band, K, and a round top flange, L, substantially as shown and described.
