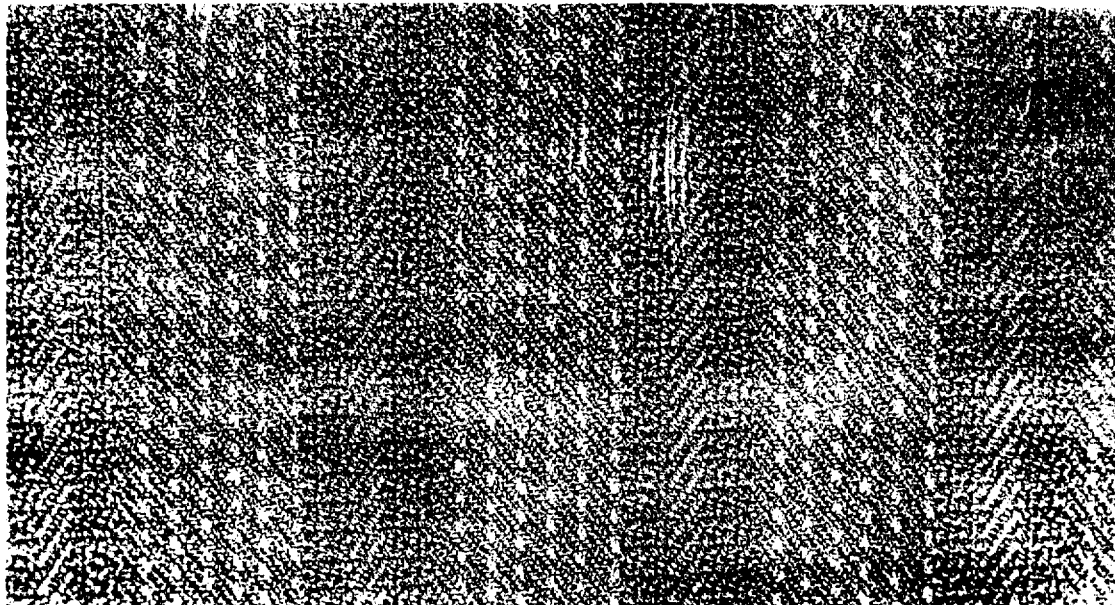

DESIGN FOR CASSIMERE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,135**, dated July 31, 1877; application filed July 18, 1877.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOSIAH PERRY, of Dudley, in the county of Worcester and State of Massachusetts, have originated and designed a Pattern in Cassimere; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying photographs, which form a part of this specification.

The design is shown by the accompanying photograph, of which the following is a description.

A represents a stripe in the cloth running warpwise, composed of three smaller stripes, striping the pattern lengthwise. The center stripe is composed of diagonal cords or weaves, running from the right, with inclination to the left. The two outer stripes are alike, and have the appearance of a dotted weave resembling small squares, the warp and weft both being plainly shown. By the construction the indentation of weave gives to the design a darker shade in contrast with stripe B.

B represents a stripe wider than A, and is composed simply of diagonal bars, starting from the left, with downward inclination to the right, and striping the pattern lengthwise.

The substantial configuration of the cloth is mixed, the cords in the center diagonal stripe in stripe A converge with the diagonal stripes which compose stripe B toward a given point, the design to be produced in any color desired.

I claim as my invention—

The design as described, and shown by the accompanying photograph.
