

DESIGN FOR CASSIMERE.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,136, dated July 31, 1877; application filed July 18, 1877. [Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Josiah Perry, of Dudley, in the county of Worcester and State of Massachusetts, have originated and designed a Pattern in Cassimere; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying photographs, which form a part of this specification.

The design is shown by the accompanying photograph, of which the following is a de-

scription.

A represents a narrow stripe running warpwise, and striping the pattern lengthwise, intersected by indentations running warpwise and weftwise, forming small squares, the whole stripe having the effect of a basket-

weave. B represents a wide stripe, formed by a diagonal weave running from left to right, and striping the pattern lengthwise, and to be produced in any color desired.

The general configuration is alternate stripes

of diagonal and basket weaves.

I claim as my invention—
