DESIGN FOR HANDLES OF SPOONS AND TABLE CUTLERY.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,147**, dated August 14, 1877; application filed July 31, 1877.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, GEORGE GILL and EDWIN L. BRITTIN, both of Derby, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have originated and designed a Pattern for the Handles of Spoons and Table Cutlery, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making part of this specification.

The drawing represents a face view of a handle ornamented by our design.

Our design consists in a club-shaped center-piece, a raised rim, and wreaths and flowers in the space between the raised rim and the club-shaped center-piece.

In the drawing, the letter A designates the handle of a spoon, ladle, fork, or other article of a similar nature, which is ornamented by a raised club-shaped center-piece, *a*, and a raised rim, *b*. The head of the center-piece

has ogee-shaped sides, as shown, while its lower end is made in the shape of a spade. The space between the center-piece and the raised rim is ornamented by flowers *c*, which occupy the space at the top of the center-piece. The space below the bottom end of the center-piece is occupied by an ornament, *e*.

What we claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for the handle of spoons or table cutlery, consisting of a raised club-shaped center-piece, *a*, a raised rim, *b*, flowers *c*, and wreaths *d*, all as shown and described.
