DESIGN FOR CARPETS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,148, dated August 14, 1877; application filed July 30, 1877. [Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, John Hamer, a citizen of Great Britain, residing in the county of Dutchess and State of New York, have invented and produced a new and original Design for a Pattern to be Printed on Druggets, Felts, or other fabrics used for carpeting, or to be inwrought in such colors as may be desired; and I do hereby declare that the photographic print accompanying this specification does give and convey to any one skilled in the art of carpet-printing a more definite and thorough description of the nature of my invention than it is in the power of language to convey, and it is sufficient to enable any
