

DESIGN FOR A PATTERN IN SUITINGS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,157, dated August 21, 1877; application filed July 25, 1877. [Term of Patent 31 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, NATHAN FRYE, of Andover, in the county of Essex and State of Massachusetts, have originated and designed a Pattern in Suitings; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying photographs, which form a part of this specification.

A represents ground of pattern, and is perfectly plain, showing warp and weft in any colors desired. B represents narrow bars formed by the weft, and running crosswise, woven at regular intervals, and forming narrow spaces, and which, by their union with

each other, form narrow stripes running warpwise and striping the pattern lengthwise, the whole having the effect of a diagonal chainweave.
