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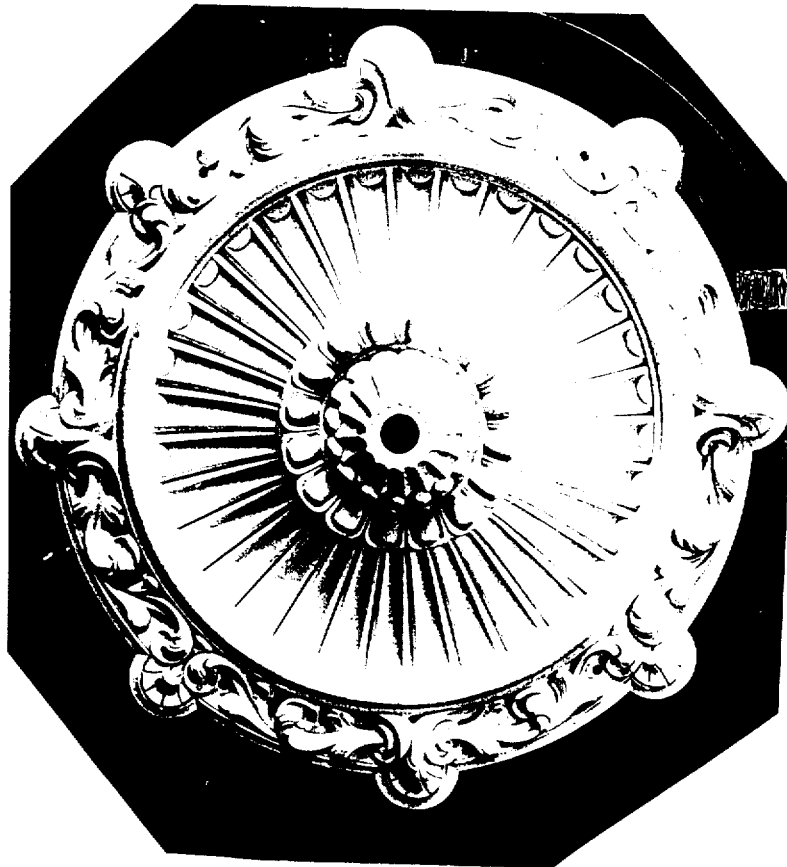

DESIGN FOR CENTER-PIECE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,161**, dated August 21, 1877; application filed July 31, 1877.
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To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, **SAMUEL KELLETT**, of the city and county of San Francisco, State of California, have invented a new and original Design for a Center-Piece, of which the following is a specification:

The invention is illustrated in the accompanying photograph and letters marked thereon.

My design consists of a drop, fluted and beaded on base. This drop is surrounded by a fringing of semi-ornamental forms. The middle portion of design is composed of fluted figures, extending to bead-molding. The outer border is formed of curled scrolls, holding stems of foliated scrolls that flow to right and left. A fillet with half-circular breaks completes outer edging. In half-circles at junction

tion of scrolls, and starting-place of same, shell ornaments are placed.

The letter **A** designates drop of center-piece; **B**, one of many figures surrounding drop; **C**, fluting forming middle portion of center-piece; **D D**, curled scrolls, holding stems of foliated scrolls **E E**; **F**, shell at junction of scrolls; **G**, fillet surrounding the whole design.

What I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for a center-piece, as shown and described.
