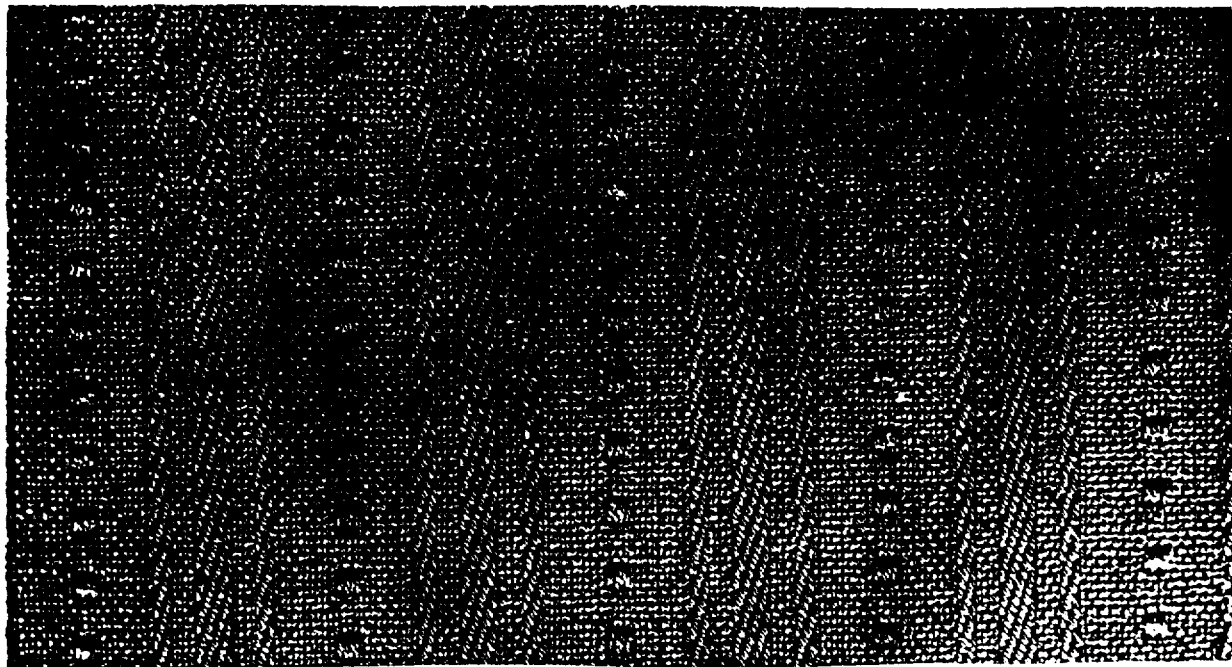

DESIGN FOR CASSIMERES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,163**, dated August 28, 1877: application filed August 13, 1877.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN T. FISKE, JR., of Pascoag, town of Burrillville, in the county Providence and State of Rhode Island, have originated and designed a Design for Cassimeres; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying photographs, which form a part of this specification.

A represents small square dots formed by the warp and running warpwise, all so arranged as to have the effect of a narrow stripe of dots running warpwise and striping the pattern lengthwise.

B represents three stripes, the center or middle one being broad, and the two outside

or border stripes narrow. They are formed by a diagonal weave running from right to left, and, as a whole, have the effect of a broad stripe running warpwise and striping the pattern lengthwise.

C represents ground of pattern, showing warp and weft in any colors desired.

I claim as my invention—

The above-described design, as shown by accompanying photograph.
