

DESIGN FOR A CORSET-GORE.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10.164, dated August 28, 1877; application filed July 18, 1877.

[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Thos. S. Gilbert, of Birmingham, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for Corset-Gores; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawing and the letters of reference marked thereon, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawing constitutes part of this specification, and represents the ornamentation applied to one of the gores of a corset.

This invention relates to a design for the ornamentation of corset gores with special reference to breast-gores; and it consists in a figure composed of two parallel lines of stitches combined with two zigzag lines of stitches, as shown in the accompanying illustration.

a a are two lines of stitches parallel to each other; c c, two corresponding zigzag lines of stitches. These four lines of stitches run in any desirable pattern, according to the taste of the manufacturer, or requirements of the trade, such figure being no part of this design, the essential features of which are a figure composed of the said four lines of stitches.

I claim-

The design for a corset-gore consisting of a figure composed of two parallel lines of stitches, combined with two corresponding zigzag lines, as described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
