DESIGN FOR CARPETS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,171**, dated August 23, 1877; application filed August 2, 1877.
[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ALFRED HILL, of Amsterdam, Montgomery county, New York, have invented or produced a new and original Design for a Pattern to be Inwrought into Ingrain and other Carpeting, in colors similar to those painted on the drawings or photographs accompanying this specification, or in other colors substituted in the place of those painted on the drawings or photographs herewith; and I do hereby declare that the drawings accompanying this specification do give and convey to any one skilled in the art of carpet-weaving a defined and thorough de-

scription of the nature of my invention, and are sufficient to enable any one skilled in the art of carpet-weaving to use my invention.
