

DESIGN FOR BACKS OF PLAYING-CARDS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,240, dated September 11,1877; application filed August 4, 1877.

[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ALFRED J. MANNING, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented and produced a new Design for the Backs of Playing-Cards, of which the following is the specification:

The border A consists of lines and dots, as shown. The panel B contains a central foliated star, a, from which radiate stems e. Curved stems i, extending across the panel, terminate in leaves and flowers b d, as shown.

I claim—

1. The design for the back of a playingcard, consisting of a border having lines and dots, substantially as shown and described. 2. The design for the back of a playing-card, consisting of a panel having stems radiating from a central star, a, crossing the panel, and terminating in leaves and flowers, substantially as shown and described.
