

## DESIGN FOR PARLOR WOOD-STOVES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,249, dated September 11, 1877; application filed August 20, 1877.

[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, NICHOLAS BRAYER, of Rochester, county of Monroe and State of New York, have invented or originated and designed a new ornamentation and configuration for Parlor Wood-Stoves, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying engraving, making a part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying engraving, to which ref-

erence is made.

The stove is oval in form in horizontal section. The body A is sheet-iron, and provided with a swaged molding, b, near the top and bottom. On the right hand, near the top, is arranged the door D, having a raised ornamented panel. The door C, in front, is arranged near the bottom, and is provided with two sections or tiers of openings. Those of the upper one are of rectangular form, and are fitted with mica panes, and an ornamented panel is provided on each side of the openings. To the button or knob s is attached a fender-plate, which is made to cover or uncover, as may be desired, the mica panes on the

inside. The lower tiers have oval or arched tops.

The button or knob a is fixed to a plate on the inside that is made to open or close these openings, and they act as draft-flues for the fire.

When the sub-base B is omitted from the stove the base-plate F is substituted for the plate E. The vertical walls of this section B are composed of cast-iron, with raised ornamented panels, as shown at P, and in front are arranged two doors, G, provided with draft-slides.

I use the swinging or detachable top T, ordinarily employed in this class of stoves, surmounted with an ornamented urn, H.

What I claim as my invention is-

The design for a parlor wood-stove, consisting of the form, contour, and ornamentation shown and described, either with or without the sub-base B.
