

DESIGN FOR IMPRINT ON BARS OF SOAP.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,256, dated September 18, 1877; application filed September 7, 1877.

[Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, NOYES W. FISK, of Springfield, in the county of Hampden and State of Massachusetts, have originated and designed a new Imprint for Bars of Soap, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the photographic illustration, making part of this specification.

The imprint which I have designed is impressed upon one or both sides of bars of soap, and represents two or more cakes, the bar being a little rounded at the edges, with a crease,

A, between the cakes, as a line to mark the division between the cakes, so that the bar has the appearance of being divided into a series of two or more cakes.

What I claim as my invention is— The design for an imprint upon bars of soap, substantially herein shown and described.
