DESIGN FOR POCKET-BOOK CLASPS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,266, dated October 2, 1877; application filed September 13, 1877. [Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Louis Messer, of the city, county, and State of New York, have originated and designed a new Pattern for Clasps for Pocket-Books and other Articles, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making part of this specification, in which drawing—
Figure 1 represents a face view of my de-

sign. Fig. 2 is a side view of the same.

Similar letters indicate corresponding parts. My design consists in the rectilinear bar, a ring and a cross-piece formed at one end of said bar, a double hook at the other end thereof, and of a circular base-plate, whereby I obtain a design presenting a handsome and distinguishing appearance.

In the drawing, the letter A designates a rectilinear bar, at one end of which is formed a ring, B, and a cross-piece, C, the ring being

exterior of the cross-piece, while at the other end of said bar is formed a double hook, D D, both parts thereof being alike, or fac-similes of each other. Beneath the parts enumerated—namely, the bar A, ring B, cross-bar C, and double hook D D—is a base-plate, E, having a circular outline.

What I claim as new, and desire to secure

by Letters Patent, is—
The design for clasps for pocket-books and other similar articles, consisting of a rectilinear bar, A, ring B, cross-piece C, double hook D D, and a circular base-plate, E, substantially as shown and described.
