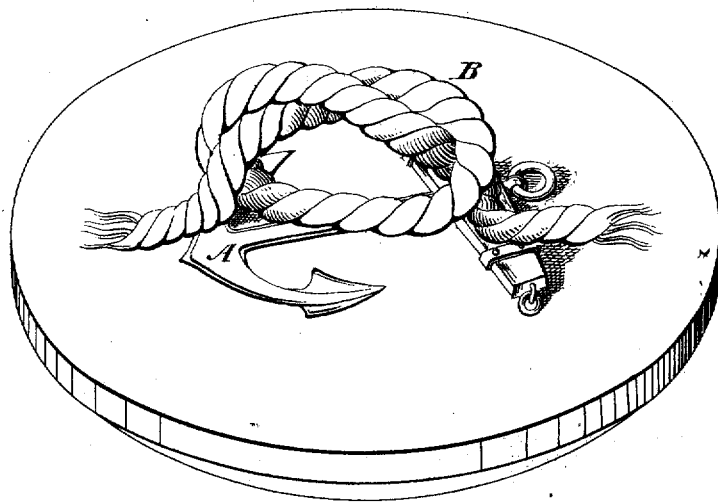

DESIGN FOR HANDLE FOR POTTERY OR GLASS WARE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,276**, dated October 16, 1877; application filed September 14, 1877.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, THEODORE HAVILAND, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for Handle for Pottery and Glass Ware, of which the following is a specification:

In the accompanying drawing, A represents an anchor formed in relief on the piece of ware to which the handle is applied, and upon the anchor a simple open overhand knot, B, is represented in the material of the ware. The ends of the rope to which the knot is formed are attached to the piece of pottery or glass ware.

The rope and the anchor may be ornamented

with colors or left plain, as may be desired, and the rope-knot may be used without the anchor.

I claim as my invention—

1. A design for a handle for pottery or glass ware, which consists in the representation of a simple open overhand rope-knot, as herein shown and described.
2. A design for a handle for pottery or glass ware, consisting of a representation of a rope-knot and an anchor formed in relief, substantially as shown and described.
