DESIGN FOR PENCIL-CASES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,282**, dated October 23, 1877; application filed July 26, 1877.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JONATHAN DARWIN COBB, of London, England, have invented a new and ornamental Design of a Pencil-Case Charm, and the following is declared to be a description of the same.

This design relates to the ornamental case or inclosure for a pencil, pen, or similar article; and said case is of an ornamental character, adapted to being hung upon a watch chain or guard as a charm. The shape and configuration of this charm *a* is that of an egg, somewhat elongated, as represented in the drawing, Figure 1, which shows the charm as in the form in which it hangs from the watch-chain. Fig. 2 shows the same ornamental-shaped case or charm *a*, with the pencil *b* and

its tube *c* drawn out. The suspending-ring *e*, at the upper end of the tube *c*, gives a finished appearance when the pencil is open or closed.

I remark that the pencil and its tube, made extensible, are articles now known and in the market.

I claim as my invention—

The ornamental design of the pencil-case, consisting of the egg-shaped body *a*, cylindrical case *c*, and suspending device *e*, as shown.
