

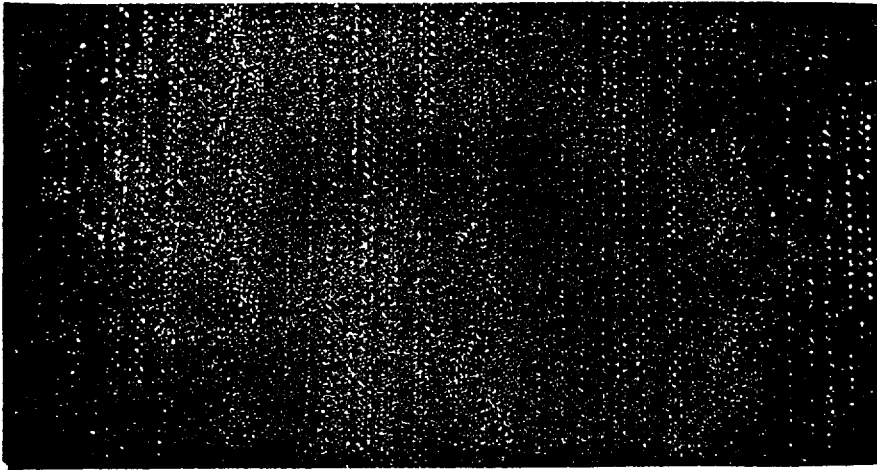

## DESIGN FOR CASSIMERES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,286**, dated October 30, 1877; application filed October 17, 1877.  
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, ALEXANDER CARMICHEL, of Westerly, in the county of Washington and State of Rhode Island, have originated and designed a Pattern in Cassimeres; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying photographs, which form a part of this specification.

A represents a number of small lines running warpwise, forming a wide stripe, which also stripes the pattern lengthwise, in any colors desired. B represents a stripe nearly as wide as stripe A, the ground of which is

ornamented with a weave of raised cords, woven into a vine-like design, the main cord continuous in its weave, with branches to right and to left at regular distances.

I claim as my invention—

The design as above described, and shown by the accompanying photograph.
