

DESIGN FOR CASSIMERES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,287, dated October 30, 1877; application filed October 17, 1877.

[Term of Patent 32 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ALEXANDER CARMICHEL, of Westerly, in the county of Washington and State of Rhode Island, have originated and designed a Pattern for Cassimeres; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying photographs, which form a part of this specification.

A represents a wide stripe running warpwise, and striping the pattern lengthwise. This stripe is embellished by a narrow cord running diagonally from right to left and from left to right throughout the entire length of the said stripe. Said stripe is further embellished by raised dots in the spaces formed by said diagonal lines as they reverse their angles on the face of the cloth.

B represents a stripe wider than A, and is composed of a number of small lines or weaves running in straight lines, and striping the pattern lengthwise. These lines are not woven in methodically, but embrace an average of twelve lines, and may be produced in any color desired.

I claim as my invention—

The design as above described, and shown by the accompanying photograph.
