

DESIGN FOR SPICE-CADDIES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,305, dated November 6, 1877; application filed October 24, 1877 [Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, EDWIN NORTON, of Chicago, in the county of Cook and State of Illinois, have invented a certain new and useful Design for Spice-Caddies; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, which will enable others skilled in the art to which it appertains to make and use the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, and to letters of reference marked thereon, which form a part of this specification.

The nature of my invention consists in a new and improved design for caddies used for shipping and retailing ground spices, as will be hereinafter more fully set forth.

The design is fully illustrated in the accom-

panying drawing.

A represents the caddy, of any desired di-mensions, having vertical back and sides, and

horizontal top and bottom.

The front embraces the following points of the design, viz: At the top is a horizontal roll, B, projecting above the front C. This front is simply a straight face extending downward a suitable distance, and on each side thereof is a beveled panel, D.

It will be seen that the edges of the panels D D are made tapering, giving the front or

straight face C appearing as if it were set back or sunk below the level of the panels.

Below the face C and panels D D is a curved

base, E, and door G, as shown.

The panels D D are further ornamented by raised or bass-relief figures I I, which may, however, be omitted, if so desired.

It is the intention to use these figures on larger cans, but omit them on the smaller ones.

Having thus fully described my invention, what I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is-

1. The design for the front of a caddy or can, consisting of the top horizontal roll B, straight face C, bevel panels D D, curved bars E, and door G, substantially as shown and described.

2. The design for the front of a caddy or can, consisting of raised or bass-relief figures I I, arranged upon panels, substantially as

shown and described.
