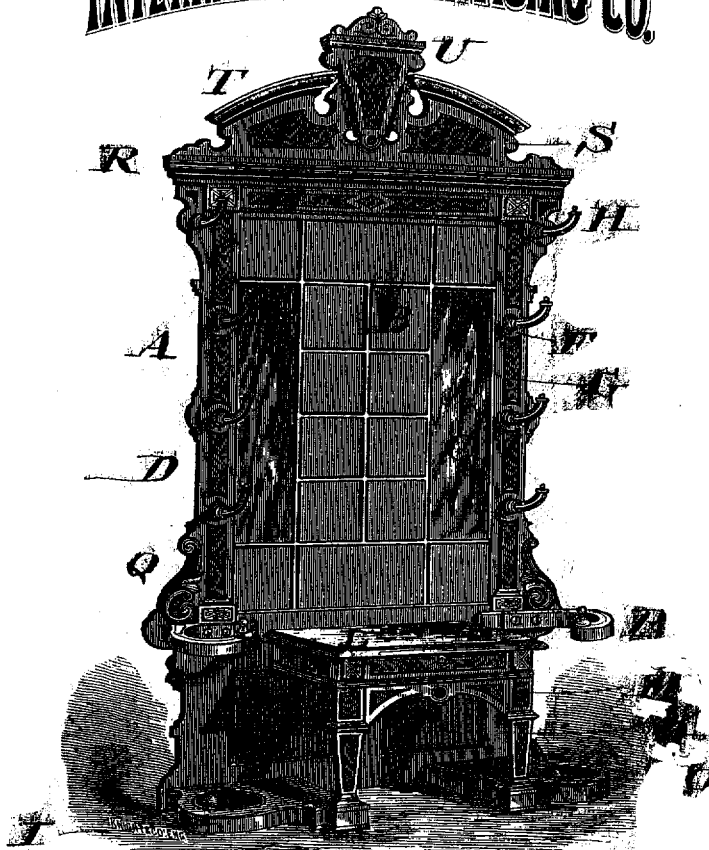

DESIGN FOR HAT-RACK.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,309**, dated November 6, 1877; application filed July 19, 1877.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, LEANDER E. FISH, of the city of Cincinnati, in the county of Hamilton and State of Ohio, have originated and designed a new and ornamental Advertising-Desk and Hat-Rack, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the annexed representation.

The subject of this invention is an ornamental configuration of an article of furniture designed to protect and display advertisements, and it comprises the following features, to wit:

A vertical frame, A, of the represented ornate configuration, and inclosing an interior space or panel, containing glass or glazed signs or other advertisements, B, at the top, bottom, and center, and a pair of mirrors, C, at the sides. On each side of said central space the frame consists of pilasters D, and at the top of said space of a frieze, E, all divided by septa into compartments G, containing raised panels of veneering.

From each septum on the pilasters, and from the frame exterior thereto, near the top thereof, projects one of a series of hat-hooks, pegs, or branches, H, of the represented ornate pattern.

From the front of the frame A, near its bottom, there project two similar bases, I, of the

represented ogee contour, and whose opposing corners constitute ornamental plinths J, which support the legs K of a desk or table, L, all of the represented ornate configuration, and decorated by raised panels, M, of veneering.

The angles formed by the legs K and table L are enriched by paneled spandrels N.

Immediately above and in rear of the arms P the panel is enriched by a pair of scroll-pieces, Q.

Above the frieze E is a cornice, R, above which rises a pediment, S, having the represented arched and interrupted border T and central shield or escutcheon U.

I claim as new and of my design and origination—

1. The combination of pilasters D, frieze E, cornice R, pediment S, escutcheon U, and scrolls Q with the ornate hat-hooks H and arms P.

2. In combination with the hat and coat rack herein described, the paneled desk or table L, having the paneled legs K J and the paneled spandrels N, as herein illustrated.
