DESIGN FOR CARPET.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,315**, dated November 20, 1877; application filed October 26, 1877.
[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, EUGÈNE DANIEL, of the city of Paris, Department of Seine, France, have invented or produced a new and original Design for a Pattern to be Inwrought into Tapestry, Brussels, and other Carpeting, in colors similar to those painted on the drawings or photographs accompanying this specification, or in other colors substituted in the place of those painted on the drawings or photographs herewith; and I do hereby declare that the drawings accompanying this specification do give and convey to any one skilled in the art of carpet-weaving a defined and thorough de-

scription of the nature of my invention, and are sufficient to enable any one skilled in the art of carpet-weaving to use my invention.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The configuration of the design hereunto annexed, as adapted to be applied to carpeting, in form similar to the drawings or photographs accompanying this specification.
