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

DESIGN FOR OASSIMERES FOR CLOAKINGS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,317, dated November 20, 1877; application filed October 31, 1877. [Term of Patent 31 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HORACE A. KIMBALL, of Providence, in the county of Providence and State of Rhode Island, have originated and designed a Pattern in Cassimere for Cloaking; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying photographs, (drawings,) which form a part of this specification.

A represents a stripe running warpwise, a series of similar stripes covering the whole face of the cloth. These stripes consist of a series of diagonal bars running from right to left and from left to right, and the interspaces, by a gradual reduction of diagonal lines, form

a series of diamond-shaped figures. Each figure is intersected at regular intervals with indented stripes running warpwise and surface stripes running weftwise, which form a square of four squares. A succession of these squares cover the face of the cloth.

I claim as my invention—
