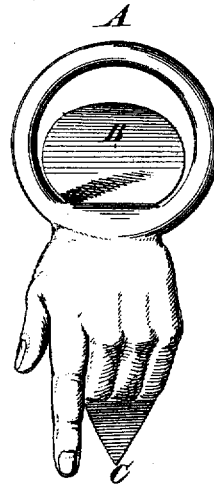

DESIGN FOR CLIPS FOR SUSPENDING CARDS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,320**, dated November 20, 1877; application filed July 6, 1877.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GEORGE W. MCGILL, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for a Clip or Fastener for Suspending Cards and other articles, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my invention is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, forming part of this specification; and consists in a piece of metal struck up to represent a human hand, having the thumb and index-finger extended and the other fingers folded, and the upper portion of the hand terminating in a ring, A. When applied to a card or other article, as intended, the hand has the appearance of grasping the card and pointing with its index-finger toward the body portion of the same.

The fastening-prongs B and C form no part of my design, and, besides, were patented to me January 18, 1876, by United States Letters Patent No. 172,466.

What I claim herein as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for a clip or fastener for suspending cards and other articles, consisting of a human hand, having its thumb and index-finger extended and its other fingers folded, and having its upper portion terminating in a ring, as herein shown and described.
