

DESIGN FOR BURIAL-CASKETS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,321, dated November 20, 1877; application filed October 19, 1877.

[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, W. MAX REID, of the village of Amsterdam, in the county of Montgomery and State of New York, have originated and designed a Burial-Casket, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing or illustration, making part of this specification.

The illustration represents a burial-casket covered with cloth or satin, and having the

blinds, ends, and corners rayed.

The sides of the casket are composed of a panel formed by a strip of molding inclosing the same, substantially as shown in the accompanying illustration. The inclosed space formed by the panel is divided into five parts,

the same being rayed and tufted alternately, commencing with the tufting, substantially as shown in the accompanying illustration.

I do not claim the raying or tufting except as used alternately upon the sides and top, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.

What I claim as new is-

A design for a casket having the sides and top alternately rayed and tufted, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
