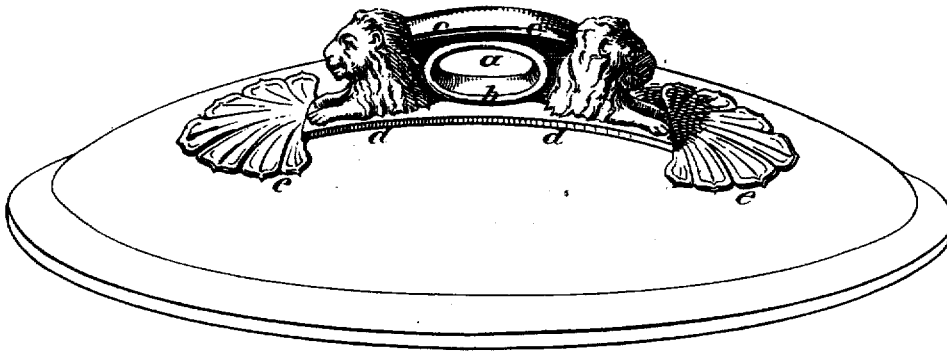

DESIGN FOR DISH-HANDLES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,325**, dated November 27, 1877; application filed November 14, 1877.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN W. BURGESS, of Orange, in the county of Essex and State of New Jersey, have invented a new and original Design for Dish-Handles, of which the following is a specification:

A represents the body or central portion of the handle, in which there is an elliptic opening, *a*, surrounded by a bead, *b*. The top of the middle portion of the handle is arched, or made convex in the direction of its length, and upon each side of the portion A, at the top, there is a bead, *c*.

At each end of the body or central portion

the head, shoulders, and fore feet of a couchant lion are placed. The lions face outward, and, together with the portion A, are planted on a base, *d*, having at each end a leaf, *e*.

This handle is more especially designed for the covers of dishes.

I claim as my invention—

A design for a dish-handle in which a couchant lion is placed at the ends of an apertured body, substantially as above described.
