## DESIGN FOR A GROUP OF STATUARY.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,336**, dated November 27, 1877; application filed November 12, 1877.  
[Term of Patent 14 years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, JOHN ROGERS, of the city, county, and State of New York, have originated and designed a Group of Statuary, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustrations, making part of this specification.

The group is called the "Traveling Magician."

On a rude platform a box has been placed and a cloth spread on top of it. Behind this the magician stands. An old man and a boy are spectators, seated in front. The magician has the old man's hat, out of which he is lift-

ing a rabbit. The tambourine-girl is seated on the platform in front, and has fallen asleep with her tambourine in her lap. A placard on front of the box announces the performance.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for a group of statuary representing the traveling magician, composed of the magician, a tambourine-girl, and spectators, substantially as above described, and shown in the accompanying illustrations.
