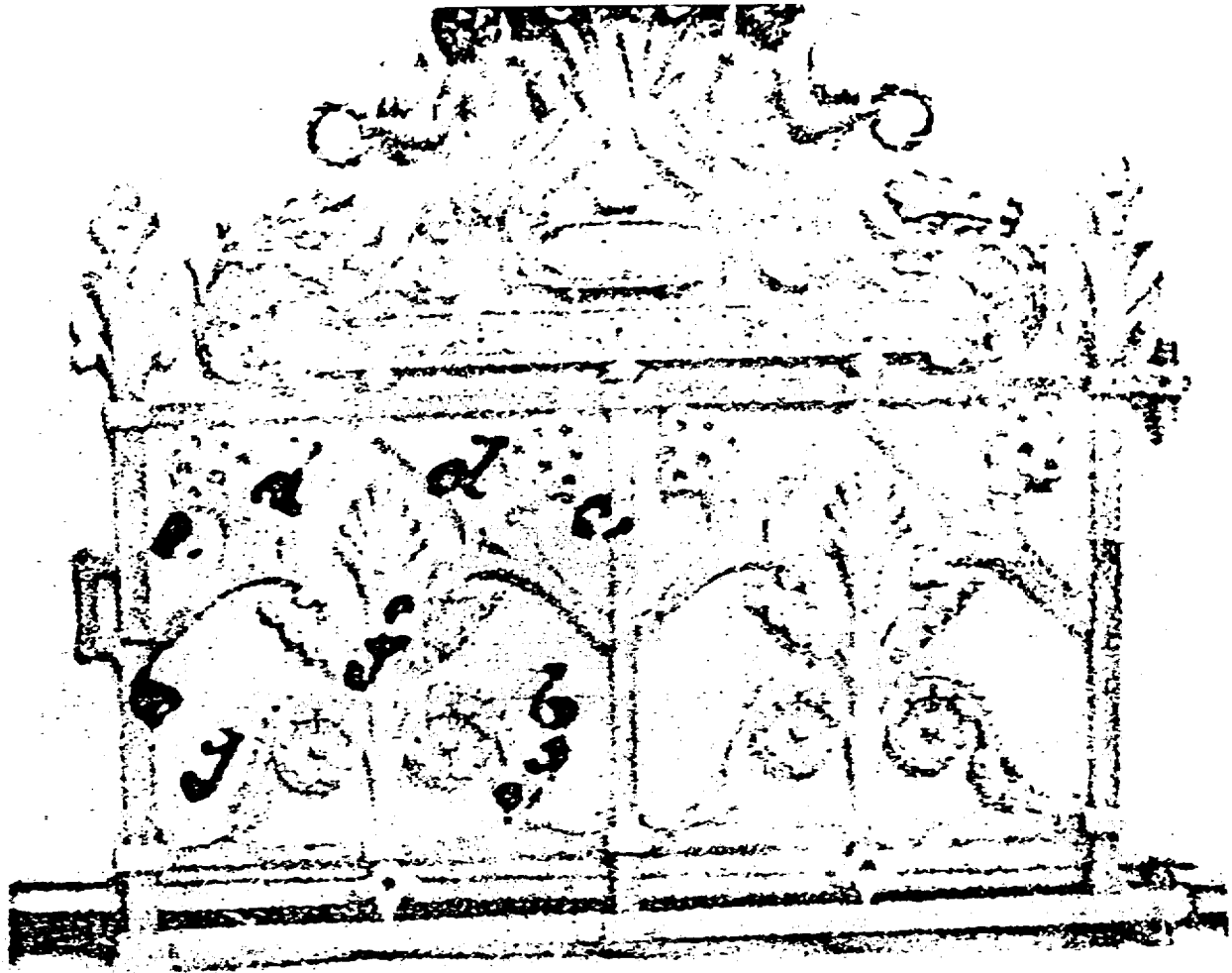

DESIGN FOR GATE AND FENCE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,337**, dated December 4, 1877; application filed November 20, 1877.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN McLEAN, of Brooklyn, in the county of Kings and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for a Gate and Fence, of which the following is a specification:

The accompanying photographic illustration represents my new design.

This invention relates to a new ornamentation for the crest or top of a gate or door, being more particularly intended for cemetery-gates; also, to a new ornamentation of the panel or panels thereof, which ornamentation is also applicable to the fences that adjoin said gates.

The letter *a* represents the crown or top of the gate. It is ornamented by two reclining human figures holding wreaths in their hands, said figures being supported on foliated scrolls, which scrolls extend between and above the figures, as shown.

The panel *b* of the gate is ornamented by two converging braces, *d d*, having projecting clusters *e*, and by a post, *f*, having projecting leaves and side scrolls *g*, as shown.

I claim as my invention—

1. The design for the crest or top *a* of a gate, the same being composed of reclining figures and ornamental scrolls, substantially as shown.

2. The design for the panel *b*, the same being composed of the converging braces *d*, post *f*, and scrolls *g*, substantially as shown.
