

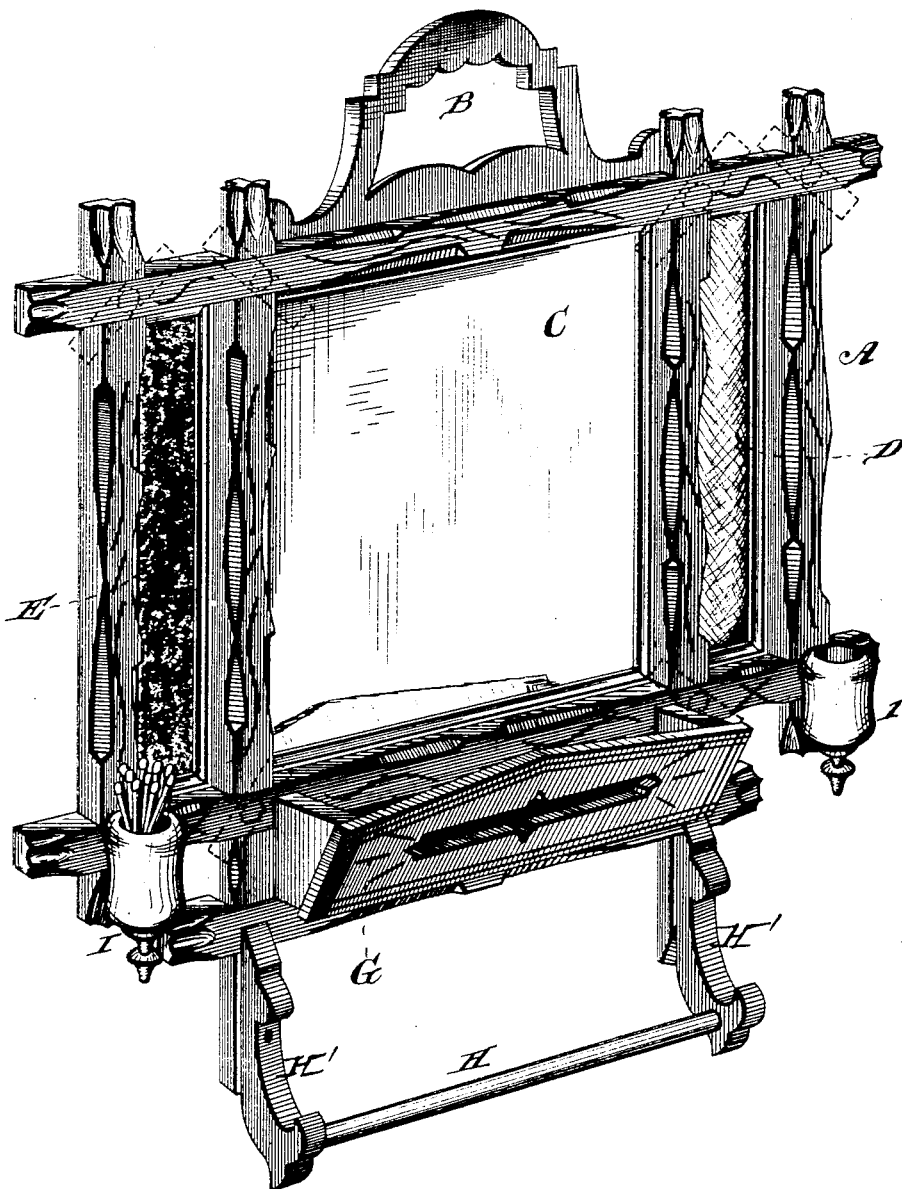

DESIGN FOR TOILET-FRAMES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,339**, dated December 11, 1877; application filed September 29, 1877.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, EMORY W. HUTCHINS, of Fremont, and ADRIAN A. HUTCHINS, of Clyde, in the county of Sandusky and State of Ohio, have invented a new and valuable Improvement in Designs for Toilet-Frames; and we do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description of the construction and operation of the same, reference being had to the annexed drawings, making a part of this specification, and to the letters and figures of reference marked thereon.

The figure of the drawings is a perspective view of our design for toilet-frames.

The nature of our design is fully illustrated in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made.

A represents the main frame of the style generally known as "rustic," with or without ornaments at the intersections of the bars of the frame. The vertical and horizontal bars forming the frame proper are chamfered, substantially as shown. In the center of the frame is arranged a mirror, C, and on the sides thereof, between the two side pieces of the frame, are the oblong rectangular strips D E, which may be made of any suitable material and color. The mirror and the strips D E are held in the panels of the frame by ogee molding, gilded. Above the mirror C is formed a central handle or eye, B, of scroll-work, and below the mirror is arranged the ornamental

pocket G, the front panel of which is grooved or fluted, and provided with a notched elongated opening, as shown. At the lower ends or corners of the frame are arranged the turned boxes I, serving, with intervening spaces, as corner ornaments to the pocket G, and below said pocket is a rack, H, having side scroll-brackets H'.

It is evident that the frame made of rustic bars may be formed of fancy molding without departing from our design.

We are aware that it is not new to form a mirror with the side strips and turned boxes; also, that the design of a mirror with a pocket below has already been patented, and we do not desire to claim such design; but

What we claim is—

The design for a toilette article, consisting of the rustic frame with mirror and side strips and panels, the pocket, boxes, and rack, substantially as shown.
