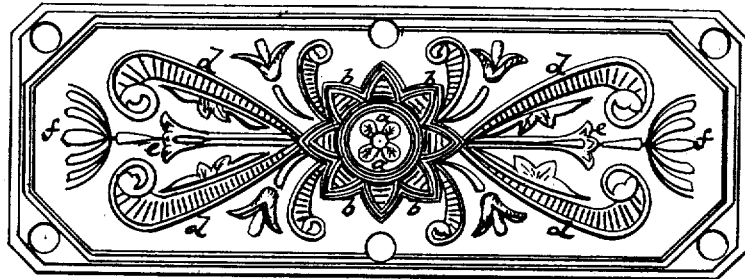

## DESIGN FOR STEP-PLATE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,350**, dated December 11, 1877; application filed November 28, 1877.  
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, MORITZ KRICKL, of the city of New York, county and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for a Step-Plate, of which the following is a specification:

The figure represents a face view of my new design for a step-plate.

Similar letters of reference indicate corresponding parts.

This invention relates to a new ornamentation of a step-plate. The surface of said plate carries a central rosette, *a*, which is surround-

ed by a series of pointed scallops, *b*. To these are joined two series of scrolls, *d*, and in each scroll is a stem, *e*, carrying a cup-shaped floral ornament, *f*.

I claim as my invention—

The design of the step-plate, consisting of a rosette, having pointed scallop *b*, scrolls *d*, and stems *e*, and cup-shaped floral ornaments *f*, substantially as shown.
