

## DESIGN FOR STEP-PLATE.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,350, dated December 11, 1877; application filed November 28, 1877. [Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, MORITZ KRICKL, of the city of New York, county and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for a Step-Plate, of which the following is a specification:

The figure represents a face view of my

new design for a step-plate.

Similar letters of reference indicate corre-

sponding parts.

This invention relates to a new ornamentation of a step-plate. The surface of said plate carries a central rosette, a, which is surround-

ed by a series of pointed scallops, b. To these are joined two series of scrolls, d, and in each scroll is a stem, e, carrying a cup-shaped floral ornament, f.

I claim as my invention-

The design of the step-plate, consisting of a rosette, having pointed scallop b, scrolls d, and stems e, and cup-shaped floral ornaments f, substantially as shown.
