DESIGN FOR FONT OF PRINTING-TYPES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,352**, dated December 18, 1877; application filed September 8, 1877.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ANDREW LITTLE, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented and originated a new and original Design for a Font of Printing-Type, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is clearly shown in the accompanying typographic impression, to which reference is made; and consists of an outline letter, shaded upon the right by a heavy line, the face of the same being shaded, as shown, by a series of horizontal lines placed one above the other.

In the letters B, D, E, F, L, P, and R the up-and-down line of the letter upon the left hand is concaved. In the letters H, I, K, and Y the up-and-down lines of the letters are concaved upon the right hand and left hand. The letters A, M, and N are provided with the angular terminations at the left-hand base of the letters. The letters C, G, N, U, V, W, and Y have the angular termination at the top upon the right-hand side. The letter X

is provided with the angular terminations upon the left at its base, and upon the right at its top. The symbol & has the angular termination upon its right. In the symbols comma, semicolon, and apostrophe, the shade-line extends below the body of the symbol, and is partially curved. In the figures 1 and 4 the up-and-down lines are concaved upon the left and right hand; and in all the figures the design is preserved.

The round terminations of the J, S, 2, 3, 5, 6, and 9 appear, it will be observed, as if formed by the bending of the end of a thin plate into a cylinder, with a heavy shade on the inner side of the plate.

Having now described my design, what I claim as new is—

The design for a font of printing-type, as shown and described.
