DESIGN FOR PARLOR OVEN-STOVE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,353**, dated December 18, 1877; application filed October 10, 1877.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JAMES A. LAWSON, of the city of Troy, county of Rensselaer, and State of New York, have invented a new and Improved Design for a Parlor Oven-Stove, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my invention of a design consists in the form and outline of the culinary attachment placed at the rear of what is known as a "parlor oven-stove" when combined with the usual and ordinary circular form of the combustion-chamber, lower mica-section, and usual base and fire-pot section; and the leading feature of novelty thus combined and constructed consists in forming the culinary inclosure in two horizontal sections or stories and placing them against, in lines of continuity, the circular parts of the stove, to which they are attached at the rear. The form of the culinary section is in the main rectangular, with rounded corners where the culinary attachment joins the circular form of the parts of the stove to which the same is attached, and the culinary attachment is divided in two sections—an upper oven-section and lower warming-closet section—by means of an intermediate molding.

In the accompanying illustration of my design for a parlor oven-stove the culinary attachment is designated as A, and is divided into the two sections B and C by the molding D. The combustion-chamber section is shown

at E, the lower mica-section at F, the fire-pot section at G, and the base-section at H.

I am well aware that the form of the combustion-chamber section, that of the mica-section, fire-pot section, and base-section are not new when considered by themselves, the only novelty being their combination with the form and outline of the culinary attachment with which they are connected, with the latter divided in two horizontal sections or stories, the upper section being for an oven outline, the lower one for a warming-closet outline, and both combined in an exterior form and divided by a horizontal molding.

Having thus described my invention of a design, what I claim, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for a parlor oven-stove, consisting of the form of the culinary attachment A, divided in the two horizontal sections B and C by means of the molding D, and at the rear of the stove joined to the circular form of the combustion-chamber section E, lower mica-section F, fire-pot section G, and base-section H, all arranged as herein shown and described.
