DESIGN FOR CARPETS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,365**, dated December 25, 1877; application filed November 21, 1877.
[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN CAMPBELL, of the city of London, England, have invented or produced a new and original Design for a Pattern to be Inwrought into Tapestry, Brussels, and other Carpeting, in colors similar to those painted on the drawings or photographs accompanying this specification, or in other colors substituted in the place of those painted on the drawings or photographs herewith; and I do hereby declare that the drawings accompanying this specification do give and convey to any one skilled in the art of carpet-weaving a defined and thorough description of the na-

ture of my invention, and are sufficient to enable any one skilled in the art of carpet-weaving to use my invention.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design hereunto annexed, when applied to carpeting, in form similar to the drawings or photographs accompanying this specification.
