DESIGN FOR ARTICLES OF JEWELRY.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,383**, dated December 25, 1877; application filed December 3, 1877.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, JAMES W. MILLER and ISAAC M. MILLER, of Newark, county of Essex, State of New Jersey, have originated a useful Design for Ornamenting Buttons, Studs, Locketts, Medallions, Charms, Pins, and Ear-Rings, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification.

A represents a bird, resting on the branch of a tree. *a a a* represent a portion of the branches of a tree. B represents a nest and eggs on the fork or branch of the tree *a a a*. *b b b b* represent the leaves on the branches of the tree *a a a*.

It is our intention to make the above design, in variegated colors, of gold.

We claim—

The design for sleeve-buttons and other jewelry, composed of the bird A, nest and eggs B, branches *a a a*, and leaves *b b b b*, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying photographic illustration.
