

DESIGN FOR OIL-CLOTH.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,385, dated January 1,1878; application filed December 8,1877.

[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, FRANZ PLOCK, of No. 5 Second avenue, in the city of New York, State of New York, have produced or invented a new and original Design for an Oil-Cloth Pattern, of which the following is a specification:

My design for an oil-cloth pattern is fully illustrated in the accompanying drawing, the main features of the design consisting of the squares A, B, and D, and triangular spaces E, F, and G, combined in the manner shown.

The squares A are veined and colored in imitation of marble. The squares B contain smaller squares a, each provided with interior ornamentation of the character shown, and having projecting ornaments c, and the squares D have central ornaments b and ornamental borders d.

The triangular spaces Eareplain, the spaces

F have ornamental line-work, and the spaces G are spotted, so as to present a mottled appearance.

Irrespective of the colors employed, I claim-

1. The design for an oil-cloth pattern, comprising the squares A, B, and D, and triangular spaces E, F, and G, irrespective of specific ornamentation.

2. The design comprising the squares A, B, and D, and triangular spaces E, F, and G, ornamented substantially as shown and described
