

TIMOTHY E. HOPKINS, OF WEST FITCHBURG, MASSACHUSETTS.

DESIGN FOR CASSIMERE.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,386, dated January 1,1878; application filed December 18, 1877. [Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, T. E. HOPKINS, of West Fitchburg, in the county of Worcester and State of Massachusetts, have originated and designed a Pattern in Cassimere; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying photographs, which form a part of this specification.

A represents a narrow stripe, composed of small bars running weftwise, which stripe the pattern lengthwise. B represents a nar-row stripe, composed of raised figures, interlacing as a chain, and as in part striping the pattern lengthwise. C represents two narrow stripes, of similar character, immediately adjacent to and on each side of stripe A, composed of small bars running diagonally, which also stripe the pattern lengthwise.

I claim as my invention—
