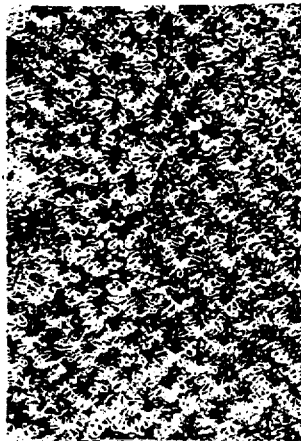

DESIGN FOR LACE PURLING.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,388**, dated January 1, 1878; application filed December 17, 1877.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ABRAHAM G. JENNINGS, of Brooklyn, Kings county, New York, have invented a new and original Design for Lace Purling, of which the following is a specification.

Figure 1 represents a photographic illustration of my new lace purling. Fig. 2 is a photographic illustration of the same design made of coarser thread.

This invention relates to a new design for a lace fabric; and it consists in providing the pillars thereof with more or less irregular lat-

erally-projecting loops, thereby imparting to the entire fabric a puckered, wavy, purl-like appearance, which is indicated in the photograph. The loops on the pillars are placed close together to increase the effect.

I claim—

The design for a lace purling the pillars whereof are provided with irregular laterally-projecting loops, substantially as shown.
