DESIGN FOR GLASSWARE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,392**, dated January 8, 1878; application filed December 26, 1877.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN H. HOBBS, of Wheeling, county of Ohio, State of West Virginia, have originated or designed a new and useful Design for Glassware; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, concise, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making a part of this specification.

The bowl A is united to a base, B, by a stem, C. The base B is supported by feet *b*, ornamented with animal heads *b'*. Around the mouth of the bowl is a series of beads, *a*. The surfaces of the bowl and base are ornamented with ribs *c*.

In making covered articles I arrange like ribs *c* and beads *a* on the cover.

The general features of the design are repeated on other articles constituting a set of table glassware, so as to secure harmony of appearance throughout, the heads *b'*, however, being used only on footed and stemmed articles.

What I claim as my invention is—

A design for glassware, substantially as described and shown.
