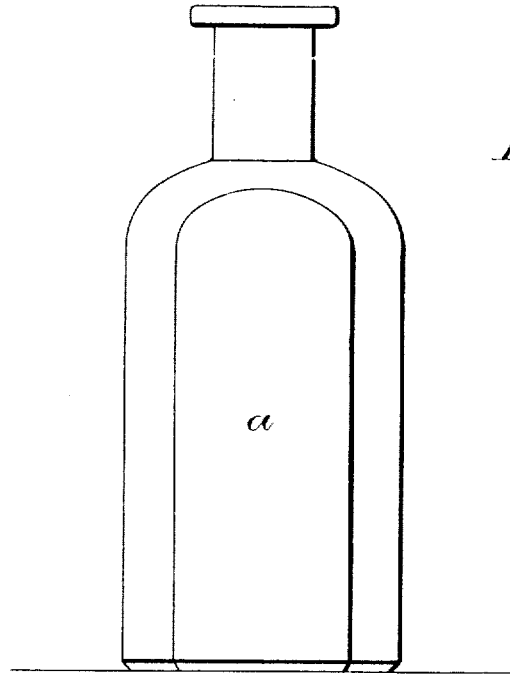

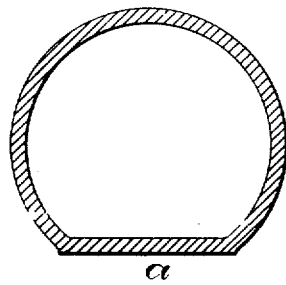

DESIGN FOR A BOTTLE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,407**, dated January 22, 1878; application filed January 12, 1878.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, RICHARD M. ATWATER, of Millville, Cumberland county, New Jersey, have produced or invented a new and original Design for a Bottle, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is illustrated in the accompanying drawing, Figure 1 being a side view of the bottle, and Fig. 2 a sectional plan view of the body, showing the conformation of the same.

The body of the bottle consists of a cylinder, the continuity of which is interrupted by the flat portion *a*, the top of the body being

rounded, as shown, where it meets the neck, and the flat portion terminating at the top in an arch which does not extend to the neck.

I claim—

The design for a bottle, substantially as described, and as shown in and by the accompanying drawing.
