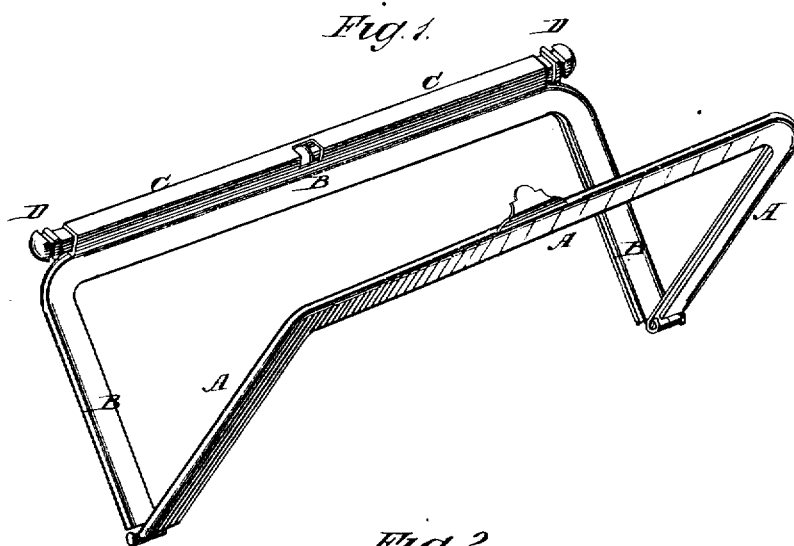

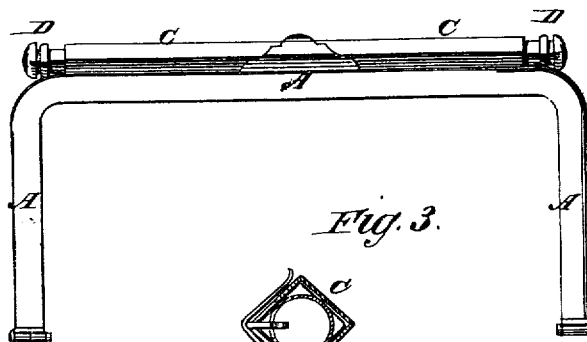
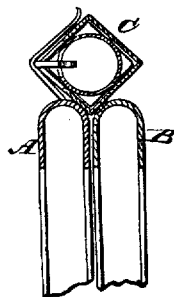

DESIGN FOR POCKET-BOOK FRAMES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,409**, dated January 22, 1878; application filed December 17, 1877.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, LOUIS PRAHAR, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for a Pocket-Book Frame, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made, and in which—

Figure 1 is a perspective view of a pocket-book frame opened. Fig. 2 is a side view of the same closed. Fig. 3 is a cross-section of the same closed.

Similar letters of reference indicate corresponding parts.

A B represent the sides of the frame, which are made plain, with rounded edges and corners. C is the catch-socket, which is made square in its cross-section, and so arranged in relation to the frame of the pocket-book that an angle may be presented in front view. At the ends of the catch-socket C are ornamental knobs D.

I claim as my invention—

The design for a pocket-book frame shown and described.
