

## DESIGN FOR LAMPS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,434, dated February 5, 1878; application filed January 22, 1878. [Term of patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ARTHUR H. BENTON, of the city of Minneapolis, in the county of Hennepin and State of Minnesota, have originated and designed a Library-Lamp; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, and to the letters of reference marked thereon, which form a part of this specification.

A represents a piece from which is suspended by means of two parallel rods, B B, of iron or other suitable material, the crownpiece C. This crown-piece C also supports or suspends the curved support D, on which the

lamp E rests.

I am aware that neither of the above parts taken by themselves is new; but

What I claim as my invention is—

A design for a library-lamp in which is the combination of the piece A, the two parallel rods B B, the crown-piece C, and the curved support D, on which rests the lamp E, substantially in the manner above described.
