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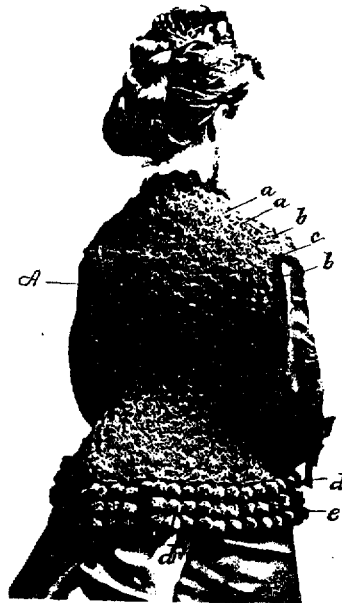

DESIGN FOR SLEEVELESS CROCHETED JACKET.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,445**, dated February 12, 1878; application filed January 11, 1878.
[Term of patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN HOLMES, of Boston, in the county of Suffolk and State of Massachusetts, have produced a new Design for a Sleeveless Crocheted Jacket, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification, which fully represents the nature of my design.

The body *A* of the sleeveless jacket is composed of wool or worsted thread, crocheted to form shell-like collections of stitches *a*. At the bottom of the jacket each shell *a* is trimmed, as shown, with balls *d*.

About the armhole are formed shell-like portions *b*, trimmed about their outer portions

with a row of loops, *c*. This same finish *b c* shown at the armhole is preferably used up the front, and about the neck of the jacket.

I claim—

The design for a sleeveless jacket, consisting of shell-like stitches *a* for the body of the jacket, and balls *d* about the lower end of the jacket, as described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
