

DESIGN FOR CARPETS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,451, dated February 19, 1878; application filed January 23, 1878. [Term of patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM DE HART, of Amsterdam, county of Montgomery, State of New York, have invented or produced a new and original Design for a Pattern to be In-wrought into Ingrain and other Carpeting, in colors similar to those painted on the drawings or photographs accompanying this specification, or in other colors substituted in the place of those painted on the drawings or photographs herewith; and I do hereby declare that the drawings accompanying this specification do give and convey to any one skilled in the art of carpet-weaving a defined and

thorough description of the nature of my invention, and are sufficient to enable any one skilled in the art of carpet-weaving to use my invention.
