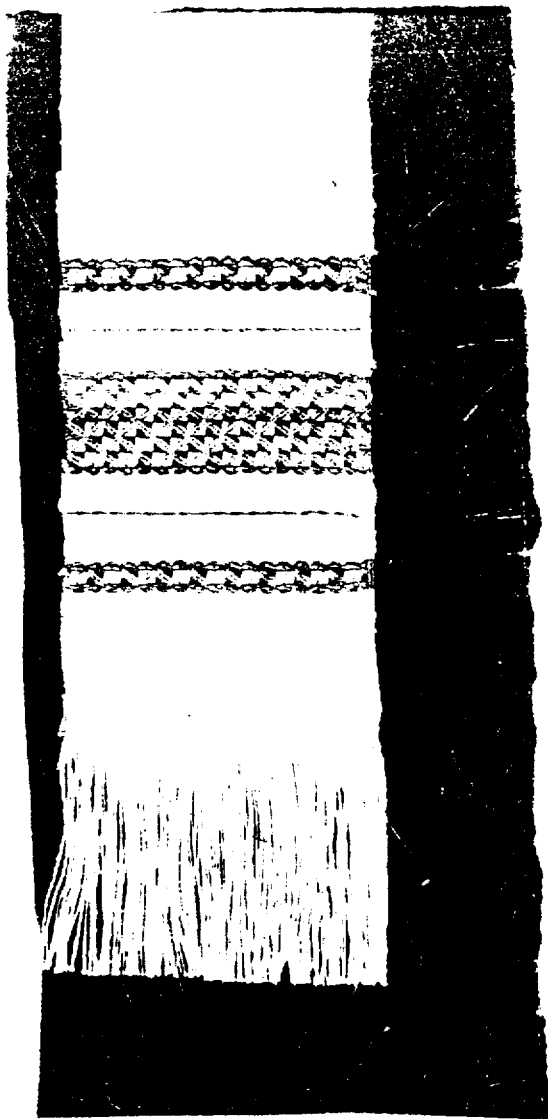

DESIGN FOR TOWELS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,495**, dated February 19, 1878; application filed January 31, 1878.
[Term of patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES J. WEBB, of Randalstown, county of Antrim, Ireland, have invented a new and original Design for Towels and Toweling, of which the following is a specification:

The border may be made in white, red, blue, or any combination of colors. There is a figure like a Greek cross in the center, with an outside edging next plain cloth, and another edging produced in the same way about one-inch from the middle line in the border.

The body of the towel consists of large diamond-shaped figures, the weft showing only at one end and the warp at the other.

I claim—

The design for toweling substantially as shown in the accompanying photographic illustration.
