

DESIGN FOR TOWELS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,495, dated February 19,1878; application filed January 31, 1878. [Term of patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES J. WEBB, of Randalstown, county of Antrim, Ireland, have invented a new and original Design for Towels and Toweling, of which the following is a specification:

The border may be made in white, red, blue, or any combination of colors. There is a figure like a Greek cross in the center, with an outside edging next plain cloth, and another edging produced in the same way about one-inch from the middle line in the border.

The body of the towel consists of large diamond shaped figures, the weft showing only at one end and the warp at the other.

I claim—

The design for toweling substantially as shown in the accompanying photographic illustration.
