DESIGN FOR TOWELS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,496, dated February 19, 1878; application filed February 1, 1878.

[Term of patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES J. WEBB, of Randalstown, county of Antrim, Ireland, have invented a new and original Design for Towels and Toweling, of which the following is a specification:

The border may be produced in white, red, blue, or any variety of color; and consists of small squares in the center, warp and weft alternately showing. The outside of the border has one line of squares with a narrow edging. The body of the towel consists of diag-

onal figures, with lines of plain cloth between the figures, each diagonal being divided into four triangles—two in warp and two in weft.

I claim—
The design for toweling, substantially as shown in the accompanying photographic illustration.
